


2023 HOLIDAY BAZAAR

Note: This registration packet only has about 25% of the information you will need for Holiday Bazaar this year. You must visit the website above for all the event information plus updates.

Holiday Bazaar is a long-standing tradition for ALL Tustin Girl Scouts. It is a boutique of handmade items made by the girls. This event is for girls to shop by themselves to purchase presents they can surprise their family and friends with during the holiday season. To accomplish this, parents, sibling, leaders, and non-Girl Scouts will not be allowed to be in the shopping area until all girl Girl Scouts are done with their shopping.

- Who: All Girl Scouts from Daisy level through Ambassador level are invited to participate.
- **Date:** Saturday, December 9 at Foothill High School (Depending on weather conditions we will either be outside in the parking lot or inside the Event Center.)
- Time Sellers: 8:30am 1:30pm (includes setup and cleanup time.)
- **Time Shoppers:** 9:30am 12:30pm. (Troops will select a 30-minute block of time to shop during online registration.)
- Time Chaperones: Cadette, Senior & Ambassador troops will be able to select their staffing times.
- **Price** for Girls and Adults which includes the custom event patch:
 - o **Early bird:** \$5 if registered by November 28.
 - Registration: \$6 from November 29 December 7 online ONLY or on December 9 at the door with cash only.
 - Selling Troops: each selling troop gets up to 4 free adults to help at the selling table.
 - Additional patches: \$1.50
- Registration Deadlines:
 - Shoppers: Early bird pricing through November 28. Regular pricing through December 9.
 - Sellers: November 28 to register that your troop is selling. Additional girls and adults can be added at the current price later.

How To Register

All attendees (girls or adults) whether shopper or seller, must complete the online registration https://tinyurl.com/RegisterHB23

Online registration will close at midnight on December 7. Additional attendees may also register at the door if needed. Depending on supplies, attendees registering at the door may not receive a patch.

CheddarUp does charge a small fee to use their system.

Please register early so we can order enough patches!!!

If you are a selling troop, a troop wanting to host a snack booth, or have girls in your troop that need special accommodations, there is an additional Google form for you to fill out. Chapterone/Snack/Accommodation Form

Notes for Sellers:

This is a non-profit activity, which means you should only recoup your costs, including the cost to attend the event. **Prices cannot exceed \$3.00.** Please try to make things that are affordable *throughout* the 25¢ to \$3.00 price range for girls to purchase.

If you are planning to sell items at the bazaar, please adhere to the tradition of having all items girl made. Adults can suggest and guide, but the majority of the work must be done by the girls!

Sellers should anticipate providing their own table, chairs and tablecloths. Maximum table length is 6'.

What items to make: We always get questions what to make. Look at our photo gallery of what has been made in year's past at https://tinyurl.com/HolBazphotos (be aware selling rules have changed over the years.) If you've been before, think about what items are not sold very much. Items for dads, brothers and even pets are not sold as frequently. Please make sure you package your items so they will safely get home in a shopper's bag.

Regarding food sales:

At your troop's Main Selling Table: All food included in items being sold must still be in the original manufacturer's packaging. If candy is sold, it must be used as a component of the final item. Example: using candy canes to create a sleigh, etc... Candy must also be in original packaging.

Selling food at a Snack Booth: Cadette, Senior, and Ambassador troops selling at a snack booth must have a troop travel plan approved and on file with their SU Manager.

Troops can sell both packaged, purchased, and homemade food items such as chips, cookies, drinks, donuts, etc... Please await confirmation from the committee before purchasing your food items. We are trying to make sure each snack booth has unique items.

Note: No power cords or open flames of any kind (camp stove, sterno, etc) will be allowed anywhere at the bazaar. This applies to displays at your main table as well as snack booth sales. Please keep this restriction in mind as you plan your snack sales. No popcorn or snow cones please.
